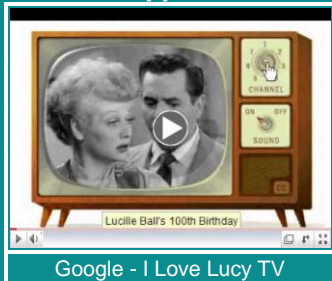

Things may seem a little quiet here at the Murray during the summer--but don't be fooled. We're already putting the finishing touches on our fall semester game plan and starting to think about next spring.

Game is the operative word for 2011-12 at the Murray Center. Our peer-to-peer support program for first year women students has a brand new look...and 16 brand new women Ambassadors to lead it with energy and enthusiasm.

As always, the goal of the Ambassadors Program is to reduce feelings of isolation and anxiety that young women sometimes experience during their transition from high school to college. The Ambassadors--successful sophomores, juniors and seniors--are trained to act role models, informants, troubleshooters, and network builders; to support academic achievement through group study; and to serve as an early warning system, alerting us to students that need extra assistance.

This year, we're adding some "serious games" into the mix: using the same motivational strategies that attract young people to online role-playing and social network sites to "gamify" homework and increase academic success. Pairs of Ambassadors will coach teams of first year women students, matched by major, as they collaborate on solving course-related puzzles and challenges...and compete for awards, loot, and bragging rights on our Got Game! Moodle website.

Not surprisingly, the most innovative ideas for our Got Game! strategy have come from the Ambassadors themselves. In fact, we're taking some of their brainstorming and working them into our new mentoring program for junior faculty--the Career Advancement Network, co-sponsored by the Murray Center's NSF-funded ADVANCE grant project and the NJIT provost, Dr Ian Gatley. In the words of the late, great Malvina Reynolds, "Some other eyes will look around, and find the things I've never found."

Sharon Gilbert, Assistant Director, Career Development Services, received the Practitioner of the Year Award for 2011. The award was bestowed by the New Jersey Cooperative Education and Internship Association in recognition of her outstanding accomplishments with the Call to Serve grant to promote federal careers to students; coordination of the FedExperience pilot program to engage seasoned alumni in second careers with the federal government; and her efforts in support of career development for students with disabilities.
