Malala Yousafzai has become an international icon for her passionate advocacy for a woman's right to education and has drawn the wrath of the Taliban. The Murray Center salutes Liz DeCarlo, Class of 2014. Liz is a double major -- Civil Engineering and Theater Arts and Technology, with her sights set on a career as an engineer in the theater. Her dream job: being part of the team that designs and builds the sets for major theatrical productions.

For the past 2 years, Liz has spent one night a week as a volunteer EMT for the Lyndhurst Police Emergency Squad. The squad is somewhat of a DeCarlo family affair -- Liz's dad has been a member for 40 years, and her older sister joined 10 years ago. When Hurricane Sandy slammed into the tri-state area, Liz spent much of her time behind the wheel of an ambulance, bringing people with serious medical issues to local health care facilities. As the storm intensified, many roads were flooded, but in spite of some 'white knuckle' moments, Liz successfully navigated alternative routes, safely delivering her patients.

In addition to a heavy academic load and her work as an EMT, Liz is an active member of the NJIT community. She served as a Murray Center Ambassador during the 2011-2012 school year, and she is currently the treasurer for the HERO campaign against drunk driving. She is also vice president of Chi Epsilon, the National Civil Engineering Honor Society and is a member of the Rutgers/ NJIT improvisational group, IT: Improv Technicians.








Wrapping up the NJIT ADVANCE Mentors & Mentees program
